- (a) The Committee is a Council Committee and it should be properly addressed as “Campus Tree Management Committee” (CTMC) and not as “Campus Tree Cutting Committee” as erroneously addressed by a section of the University community.
- (b) Felling of trees is just a minute aspect of the Committee’s mandate and requests for such should be fully justified. The Committee is also not a commercial outfit, but salvaged wood may be sold to willing and able buyers, with preference for members of the University community.
- (c) Because of the large volume of requests for its services, the Committee may require a minimum of two weeks notice to treat requests, except in cases of emergency.
- (d) The Committee **does not accept cash payment for services**. However, members of the Community making requests may be obliged to provide consumables (engine oil and petrol) for services requested.
- (e) All trees, whether standing or down are the property of the University. Members of the University community (particularly, Abadina community) should please refrain from “**Scavenging**” wood of any type without due authorization. Such action amounts to pilfering and will attract appropriate sanctions by the University authorities.
- (f) Setting of **fire** on any tree, no matter how small is **illegal** and thus prohibited.
- (g) The CTMC has opened an e-mail address (uictmc@yahoo.com) and will welcome ideas as to how best to manage the trees on our campus. The Committee pleads for full cooperation of all in its strive to sustain the acclaimed status of this University as a Beautiful Parkland Campus.
