**6. COUNCIL DECISION: CIVIL/PUBLIC SERVANTS AND POLITICAL PARTIES**

Council at its Inaugural Meeting held on Friday, 27 February, 2009 considered the paper from the Legal Unit (Council Paper No. 09/04) and noted that under the law:

- (i) Civil/Public Servants could be card-carrying members of any political party of their choice;
- (ii) Any Civil/Public Servant who wishes to seek an elective public office shall give contract notice based on his/her status (i.e. one month notice in the case of Junior Staff, three months for Senior Staff and six months for Professors) to resign his/her appointment before election to the office is held;
- (iii) Members of staff who hold appointment(s) outside the University service should so inform the University Administration.

**7. CUSTOMS DUTY PAPERS FOR FAIRLY USED VEHICLES**

With the current trend in law enforcement by the Nigeria Customs Service, it is necessary and compulsory that all Deans, Directors and Heads of Departments/Units

- (i) Obtain authentic customs papers for any fairly used vehicles that would be purchased for the University.
- (ii) Make the customs papers and the vehicles available for Audit inspection.

**8. PROCUREMENT OF UNITED STATES VISA**

Members of staff of the University who have official cause to approach the United States Embassy for the procurement of visa should please do so through the Office of the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) at least three weeks before the date of travel to the United States. This is to enable the Public Affairs Section of the United States Mission in Nigeria facilitate the issuance of the Visa under consideration.

A group operating as Double Diamond Consults of 74 Aba Road, Opposite Government Craft Centre, Port Harcourt, are going to University campuses all around the country posing as agents who could help faculties and staff apply for the Fulbright programme. They have been circulating posters and flyers about the Fulbright Programme and asking naïve and unsuspecting individuals to make non-refundable payments for courier charges/handling fees of their Fulbright applications at designated banks. Please be advised that any offer to serve as an agent in the Fulbright process is a scam. The US Mission in Nigeria maintains total control of all aspects of the Fulbright scholar recruitment process and there are no fees associated with the programme for either the scholars or participating institutions. Administering agencies in the United States consider ONLY those Fulbright applications that have been duly submitted through US Mission offices.
